The Christmas story of Jesus coming into the world is always a reminder of Hope always being visible, even in the most desolate of situations (a dirty stable in Bethlehem!). Let's embrace the 2019 Christmas Season with that Spirit of Hope, knowing that each one of us represent the reality that Christ is present in our world through our acts of charity, love and gentleness to each other and importantly to myself. Go gently.

Paces of St Pats

Audrey Clark

At the 9am Mass on Christmas Day in 2018, longtime parish organist played for our St Pat's Mass for the last time. After Mass, in appreciation of her service to our parish, Audrey was presented with a bouquet of flowers, and her granddaughter spoke on her behalf.



For the past 20 years, she had been the church organist here at Mortlake, playing for Sunday mass, funerals, weddings and other church events. It has been said that to sing is to pray so we are very grateful that for so many years Audrey gave us her generous gift of music to help us pray. She has also been church organist at parishes in Homebush and Strathfield and more lately at St Pat's, when she and Tony moved to Mortlake. Audrey was always assisted by her husband Tony, who put up the numbers of the hymns on the board at the front of the church.

This is an extract of her granddaughter's speech outlining Audrey's career:

'Audrey was a remarkable musician from a very young age. Aged just 13, she entered the open division of the City of Sydney Eisteddfod for Piano.

After finishing school, she was awarded a scholarship to the Sydney Conservatorium of music, aged16. She excelled as a pianist and was offered a scholarship to study in London, which she declined. She distinguished herself at University and was invited to pursue a career as a concert pianist, but chose instead to become a high school music teacher, and she married my grandfather, Tony.

Nana was also a piano teacher at Santa Sabina College and until recently taught musicianship in her home, assisting HSC students with their studies. Unsurprisingly, she earned a reputation for her students always receiving top grades.

Nana taught her five children to play the piano and appreciate music. Her gift of the love and mastery of music has been passed onto her loving grandchildren, as you have all heard today in the voice of her granddaughter, my sister, Emily'.

We at St Pat's have been so fortunate that Audrey shared her love of music with us for so many years. We have indeed prayed twice and are so very blessed, thank you, Audrey.

arewell Monsignor John

On Sunday morning 4th August a good crowd of our parishioners attended a farewell for our beloved parish priest, Monsignor John Usher. The farewell was held in the grounds of St Patrick's Primary School fittingly outside of 'The John Usher' building. The farewell



included tributes to Monsignor John including an acknowledgement of his great contribution to our parish here at St Patrick's and beyond.

Interesting that during his education where he obtained a Bachelor of Theology, Bachelor of Social Work and Master of Social Work, he attended St Patrick's College at Strathfield and St Patrick's Seminary at Manly — it seemed therefore that he was destined for St Patrick's at Mortlake. John was appointed to St Patrick's Mortlake in May of 1986 and was made our Parish Priest in October 2003. During that time he was also a director of Centacare from 1983 to 2004 and the Chancellor and Vicar General of the Archdiocese of Sydney for ten years till 2015. Notwithstanding these significant appointments he managed and developed our parish into the wonderful environment it is today. We wonder how he managed all of these duties in addition to the weddings, baptisms funerals, hospital & home visits to the sick and the comfort he gave us when needed. This was as well as the daily Masses and sacraments and other calls on him as required. But whilst Monsignor John has reached the finish line of his priestly duties he is on the starting line of his well-deserved retirement.

To assist him along the way the parishioners provided him with some gifts and mementos including travel and transport vouchers, some 'Usher Scotch' and a wonderful book which documents his time here at St Patrick's with lovely farewell comments from many of the friends he has made here. Thanks to Len Norman for assembling this book. Anne Manenti also gave a short address in Italian.

John Usher has touched the lives of all of us here at St Patrick's Mortlake and we thank him for dedicating his life to our church. We all wish him a wonderful and well-earned retirement and hope that we will continue to see him from time to time.

Thanks to St Pat's Principal, Mandy Westgate for offering the school grounds and to her staff for their assistance on the day. Also thanks to Brenda Johnson and the Social Ministry team for serving the morning tea.

daith Education

The Faith Education Ministry here at Mortlake includes aspects of improving the knowledge of our faith. Under this umbrella includes:

- Providing Catechetical support to give scripture lessons to the Catholic Children at Mortlake Primary School. We currently have 12 catechists and assistants who service the seven classes at that school.
- Preparing children with instruction for the Sacraments of Reconciliation, First Holy Communion and Confirmation. This now includes St Patrick's Primary School at Mortlake which will significantly improve the numbers in coming years.
- ☼ Offering Parishioners with Adult Education opportunities on faith topics. This includes guest speakers, local presentations, films etc with the next presentation being a two part session on the Creed to be presented by a guest speaker in November. We are also looking at an Advent Program and a presentation on Forgiveness and Mercy following Sunday Morning Mass over the next few weeks.
- ♣ RCIA This is the instruction and welcoming onto our church of adults who want to become a Catholic. It is a structured program of welcome, instruction and friendship prior to the official joining the church which generally occurs at the Vigil Mass at Easter.
- ♣ Baptismal preparation Preparing families to have their child Baptised — currently managed by Amanda Gierek and Brenda Johnson.

Margaret was instrumental in commencing the Team and was a brave, dynamic and inspirational woman. She combined a very efficient, intelligent and pragmatic approach with a wicked sense of humour which made our team a very productive, but fun group.

The beautiful and moving celebration of Margaret's life was concelebrated by Mons John and Fr Tom, and during the homily Mons John spoke about how Margaret gave us so much and how we have much to learn from her.

Margaret's husband, Geoff's eulogy was also very moving in paying tribute to a remarkable woman. He gave us an awe-inspiring description of Margaret as daughter, student, wife, mother, grandmother and friend. He spoke of her courage, the importance of her friends and her commitment to St Pat's.

Margaret lived a very full life completing an adult education degree part-time and a Masters degree. Rather than go onto a PhD, Margaret joined TAFE and rose from a Public Relations and Marketing teacher to Professional Development Manager, a position she found stimulating and challenging and where she

was surrounded by friends from a great staff group, including many brilliant women like herself.

She was also very involved in her children's lives and education and held positions of NSW Children's Playgroup President as well as President of several Parents and Friends Associations.

She gave school key-note addresses, assisted with debating, canteen duty and was even chief cook and clothes washer for the cricket team.

Margaret often spoke of her children with great pride. Over time, Margaret welcomed new friends to the family: Dave with Megan, Amie with Evan, Sophy with Rowan and Jess with Neil. And extra special people came along too. There was Julian and granddaughters Eleanor, Isabelle and Elizabeth. Margaret loved them fiercely with all her heart.

In 2018 she even started a law degree at Notre Dame University. She lived her dream as a 64 year-old surrounded by fellow 19 year-old students, working hard, mentoring with lots of life experience and passing with Distinctions.

And of course, she loved her friends and the community of St Patrick's at Mortlake. As well as being an integral member of the Parish Council and leader of the Communications Team, she was also a valuable acolyte, serving Masses with pastors like Fr Tom and Fr John, whom she admired so much.

The community of St Patrick's at Mortlake are very sad at Margaret's passing and we offer our sympathy to Margaret's family, her husband, Geoff, her children
