## JESUIT REFUGEE SERVICE FOOD APPEAL

The Jesuit Refugee Services (JRS) supports struggling asylum seekers, both individuals and families, who rely on donations to survive. During the current lockdown clients that come to JRS Services Foodbank have been unable to come to the Centre. JRS has developed a safe drop-off system of bags of groceries to clients' homes. However, the number of requests has grown week by week.

## PARISH GREEN SPACE REMEDIATION WORKS

**GREEN SPACE:** Remediation is essential to the green space adjacent to the Presbytery to allow for school use, parking, and church community use. We have had discussions with a landscape designer, Catholic Education Office (CEO) and their architect on the basis of remediating the space focusing on Parish longer term needs including a meeting and celebratory space.

Sketches are being produced for the concept which could provide a valuable resource to our community. The Architect costs are being paid by the CEO.

The Architect has also looked at the hall and been asked to provide some thoughts on its potential if upgraded. He has made an observation that the hall kitchen could be opened up allowing integration into the green space plans thus increasing its value to our community.

This is early stages with possible costs yet to be received and evaluated in conjunction with broader discussion to decide its place in the Parish financial plans.

**Parish Finance:** Due to the reduction in our turnover we have made successful applications for assistance under the Governments Covid Schemes. ## STEP 1 - RELAXING CHURCH RESTRICTIONS

My friends, as I write this, like many things in our Covid-world, details are emerging as to what we as a Church are permitted to do, as **Stage 1** of restrictions being eased takes effect from this **Friday 15 May**.

It is important to note that:

- The 4 square metre rule applies to all activities that we engage in at all times.
- Regular hand washing using hand sanitisers is required.

Moving forward, I advise of the following:

- There remains NO PUBLIC MASSES.
- No public Masses will be available on Sunday.
- "Booked" Masses for gatherings of 10 people or less are now permitted from 15 May. See note below on how to register.
- The gathering of 10 individuals does not include ministers and servers. I will be conducting private Masses for groupings of up to 10 people on the days Tuesday through to Friday, and a Mass on Sunday.
