PARISH GREEN SPACE REMEDIATION WORKS

GREEN SPACE: Remediation is essential to the green space adjacent to the Presbytery to allow for school use, parking and church community use. We have had discussions with a landscape designer, Catholic Education Office and their architect on the basis of remediating the space focusing on Parish longer term needs including a meeting and celebratory space. The Architect costs are being paid by the CEO.

The Architect has also looked at the hall and been asked to provide some thoughts on its potential if upgraded.

Sketches have now been produced for the remediation of the green space. I attach the architect's and landscaper's initial **concept design** for the green space. I welcome your comments on it. This is early stages with possible costs yet to be received and evaluated in conjunction with broader discussion to decide its place in the Parish financial plans.
