A reading from the prophet Isaiah Is 40:1-5. 9-11

Prepare the way for the Lord.

SECOND READING

A reading from the second letter of St Peter 2 Pt 3:8-14

We wait for new heavens and a new earth.

There is one thing, my friends, that you must never forget: that with the Lord, 'a day' can mean a thousand years, and a thousand years is like a day. The Lord is not being slow to carry out his promises, as anybody else might be called slow; but he is being patient with you all, wanting nobody to be lost and everybody to be brought to change his ways. The Day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then with a roar the sky will vanish, the elements will catch fire and fall apart, the earth and all that it contains will be burnt up.

Since everything is coming to an end like this, you should be living holy and saintly lives while you wait and long for the Day of God to come, when the sky will dissolve in flames and the elements melt in the heat. What we are waiting for is what he promised: the new heavens and new earth, the place where righteousness will be at home. So then, my friends, while you are waiting, do your best to live lives without spot or stain so that he will find you at peace.

The beginning of the Good News about Jesus Christ, the Son of God. It is written in the book of the prophet Isaiah:

GOSPEL (continued)

Look, I am going to send my messenger before you; he will prepare your way. A voice cries in the wilderness: Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight, and so it was that John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. All Judaea and all the people of Jerusalem made their way to him, and as they were baptised by him in the river Jordan they confessed their sins. John wore a garment of camel-skin, and he lived on locusts and wild honey. In the course of his preaching he said, 'Someone is following me, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to kneel down and undo the strap of his sandals. I have baptised you with water, but he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit.'

CHILDREN'S LITURGY – ADVENT

Today is the 2nd Sunday in the season of Advent.

The Advent Wreath in the Sanctuary will have two candles lighting. Last week was **HOPE** this week the 2nd purple candle represents **PEACE**.

Today we hear more about getting ready for Jesus. We are using a different idea. We are going to hear about preparing the way for Jesus – like a path or a road and making that path as peaceful as possible. When we are ready and prepared this brings us great peace. We are going to hear about a special prophet who told people that Jesus was coming. This person is called John The Baptist.

Today's Gospel reading comes from the book of Mark. (Mark 1:1-8)

Activity to do at home:

- As a family, make a list of things you think are important for your family to do during the Christmas holiday season. Prioritise everyone's favourite activity and make the season making the "path" as smooth and enjoyable as you can.

St Patrick's is collecting non-perishable food every week. You can also choose a person from the Catholic Care frame and buy your person a gift for Christmas.
- Take a walk outside together. Look at the "rough ground" of a path. Talk about things you could do to smooth out the path and compare this to things you can do to help your life run more smoothly.
- Don't forget to add your prayer for PEACE on a purple strip and we will add your prayer to our Christmas Tree in the narthex/foyer.
