FIRST READING

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles Acts 2:1-11

They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak different languages.

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome - Jews and proselytes alike - Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

There is a variety of gifts but always the same Spirit; there are all sorts of service to be done, but always to the same Lord; working in all sorts of different ways in different people, it is the same God who is working in all of them. The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose.

Just as a human body, though it is made up of many parts, is a single unit because all these parts, though many, make one body, so it is with Christ. In the one Spirit we were all baptised, Jews as well as Greeks, slaves as well as citizens, and one Spirit was given to us all to drink

CHILDRENS LITURGY



This the Feast of Pentecost! This is the feast we have been waiting 50 days for; it's the coming of the Holy Spirit and the official birthday of the church! Jesus wants us to have peace with each other, to read his Holy Word, to love one another

and to pray! The symbols used when we talk about the Holy Spirit are Fire, Wind and Doves. Fire and Wind are two very strong elements. Fire burns old things away to make room for new and kills germs that spread disease. Here in Australia, we have trees that produce seeds only after they have been burnt! Wind blows things away, brings new things in, it creates energy and power. Jesus' friends, the Apostles, were waiting for the Holy Spirit to come to them as Jesus promised. The Holy Spirit brought the Apostles gifts of strength, wisdom, understanding, good judgement, courage, desire to praise and please God in everything they would go on to do. We have a special Sacrament called Confirmation that you will receive when you are in Year 6 or when you are older. In this Gospel we hear about another Sacrament – listen carefully and see if you can recognise which one it is. Jesus makes one action that is a symbol of the Holy Spirit – I wonder if you will spot it?

Did you hear which Sacrament Jesus mentioned? Jesus said to the Apostles that they could forgive sins in his name. Some of you might have just received the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Can you remember what that was like? When we are forgiven, it feels great. We stop worrying about what might have been upsetting us and we are ready to move forward.

Activities to try as a family at home:

- We all love a party and cake why not have a little party and some cake to celebrate the birthday of the Church on this Pentecost Sunday?
- Ask the people in your family about their Sacrament of Confirmation or Sacrament of Reconciliation. I wonder what they will tell you.
- Make a list of the word HELLO in all the languages you can think of.
