CHILDREN LITURGY

This Sunday we hear about Jesus and the disciples being out on a boat during a storm. The Gospel is about trusting Jesus and knowing that he is always with us. It is ok to feel scared sometimes — what do you do when you feel scared? Do you go and speak to your parents, grandparents, or carers? How does that make you feel? Safe? Calm? Jesus surrounds us with people that we can go to when we feel we need comfort or help.

All of us get scared at times. Have you ever been caught outside during a storm? Maybe you remember a time in your back garden, in the school playground, or even in the park when you have been playing sport, when a storm is gathering. It can be very scary. Jesus wants us to know that he is ALWAYS with us and will ALWAYS help calm the storms of our lives.

So, the message of Jesus is that we need to put our trust in God in all aspects of our lives, just as the disciples learned in the gospel today. When we are worried or afraid, we might say a little prayer saying; God you calmed the winds, make things calm in my mind and in my life, so I am happy and at peace.
