But his face fell at these words and he went away sad, for he was a man of great wealth.

Jesus looked round and said to his disciples, 'How hard it is for those who have riches to enter the kingdom of God!' The disciples were astounded by these words, but Jesus insisted, 'My children,' he said to them, 'how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God.' They were more astonished than ever. 'In that case' they said to one another, 'who can be saved?' Jesus gazed at them. 'For men' he said, 'it is impossible, but not for God: because everything is possible for God.'

PARISH FINANCES UPDATE

I am pleased to report that the Parish applied for and has now received a COVID payment of \$15,000 from the NSW Government. This amount has been offset against weekly shortfall between fixed costs per month of approx. \$9000 and income of \$5000. This month we have paid the annual insurance premium for the Parish at \$20,450.00. Public Masses will resume in the parish from Tuesday 26 October.
