CHURCH RE-OPENING WEEKEND MASSES WILL RESUME 30 & 31 OCTOBER

At 80% fully vaccinated we will open our church and ceremonies to "mixed" congregations, including fully vaccinated, partially vaccinated and, as yet, unvaccinated. The 4 sqm rule will apply and masks must be worn indoors.

We will <u>not</u> be required to check a person's vaccination status. We will do all that is reasonably possible to keep everyone safe who comes to church: there will continue to be social distancing, hand sanitising, no singing, etc.

Numbers will be limited to 75 people inside the church. We hope to be able to hold outdoor Masses. Weekday and weekend Masses will return at the usual times as listed above and bookings can be made via the trybooking link:
