Dear parishioners of St Patrick's,

We now approach the Easter celebrations which announce Hope and Joy to a fractured world. We do this in the midst of what has become the almost continual tensions of the Covid pandemic, added to by the horrific sorrow and grief of the invasion of the Ukraine and the devastating effects of the flood in recent times. The **Alpha course** has provided parishioners an opportunity to understand Jesus Christ, Son of God. 

There were four instruction sessions prior to the sacrament and all were concluded successfully despite some issues with Covid absentees and isolations. Thanks to catechists Denise Norman, Sinead Kent and Bob Mayor for preparing the candidates to receive the sacrament.

The St Pat's Community sends their prayers and best wishes to these young people as they continue

ongratulations and Blessings


