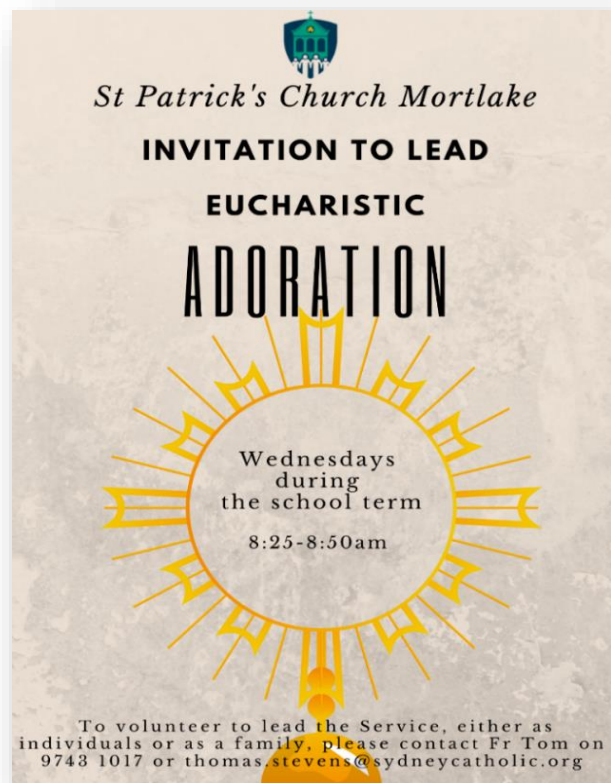
### GOSPEL
