Che Sense of the Sacred this Easter

As we approach Easter 2023, we reflect on the sense of the **Sacred** in our lives. What are those aspects in our lives that pertain to God, above the human condition that we can experience through our senses, to aspects of the heavenly as opposed to the earthly? Ultimately **Love** is the aspect that draws us to an understanding of God. Love of family, friends and love of God reaching out to us through our Sacraments.

I think our Catholic Tradition (and the Orthodox), through the Sacraments, predisposes us to a sense of the Sacred, the Absolute, those things which do not change. Our Sacraments are the outward physical signs of God's grace in the visible sign of the Sacraments we receive. Our Catholic understanding of the Sacred nature of the Sacraments is important to our identity.

Thankfully, our Church and our broader society, (which has in the past been largely moulded in thought through a mostly European mindset), is on a journey to a broader understanding of the Sacred in other cultures, especially for our First Nations peoples. The sense and understanding of the Sacred for Aboriginal people to our magnificent Australian land is real, in the same sense of our Catholic understanding of Sacred. For Aboriginal people, that Sacred lay in the Dreaming, pointing to an understanding of God. The two are not incompatible, for they seek to point us to God, the Absolute.

As Christians, the ultimate Graced moment of God in our lives, in our families in our relationships and through the Church, occurs at Easter when Christ suffers, dies, and rises from the dead. At this most Sacred time, we pray we can journey as a community of faith, ever seeking to have a greater understanding of the Sacred and its meaning for different cultures, seeking unity and understanding that we are all created and sustained by the same Creator Spirit. May we continue the Journey. Peace and Joy Easter 2023.

aster and the Noly Oils

On Maundy Thursday, Maureen and Kevin Casey will make their fourth pilgrimage from St Pat's, Mortlake to St Mary's Cathedral to collect the newly blessed and consecrated Holy Oils on behalf of our parish.

The Church makes use of three holy oils: the Oil of the Sick, the Oil of the Catechumens and the Holy Chrism Oil. The first two are blessed, and the bishop consecrates the third, during the annual Chrism Mass. Each has a distinctive purpose in the Church. https://www.simplycatholic.com/what-are-holy-oils/

Attendance at this Mass at St Mary's is a special privilege and a reverent sensual treat. Prayer is offered

in many forms. The bells ring, the censers are swung by the altar servers and priests and the aromatic scent of incense explodes as the choir's voices rise up and the beautiful sounds of the big organ echoes throughout the vast cathedral. The procession of the attendants bearing big urns which hold the special oils is very majestic. After the blessing, representatives of the archdiocese parishes collect enough of the oils to take 'home'. Symbolically, our bishop is present at every ceremony or occasion these oils are used, for us, specifically, Baptism, Confirmation and the anointing of the sick.



The World Day of Prayer is an international ecumenical Christian lay women's initiative. It is run under the motto "Informed Prayer and Prayerful Action," and is celebrated annually in over 170 countries on the first Friday in March. The movement aims to bring together women of various races, cultures and traditions in a yearly Common Day of Prayer, as well as in closer fellowship, understanding and action throughout the year.

This year, St. Patrick's hosted the World Day of Prayer in this area. The theme this year was TAIWAN. The prayer was led by the organising committee and St. Patrick's Liturgy Ministry and the Social Ministry provided hospitality. It was good to be able to celebrate with people of other faiths to pray with and for Taiwan.

The blessing of the new Statue of Jesus & Jubilee Commemoration began with an introduction and Father welcome from Tom Stevens, Parish Priest. Special quests included Ms Sally Sitou, MP, member for Reid, the sculptor, Ms Linda Klarfeld and Mr Leslie Fernandes, who donated the statue. Councillors from Canada Bay Council

also attended: Ms Stephanie Di Pasqua, and Ms Julia Little. Many members of the parish were in attendance, including a contingent of students from St Patrick's School together with their Principal, Ms Amanda Westgate. Members of the Social Ministry provided the refreshments.

The statue was unveiled by Father Tom, Ms Linda Klarfeld, sculptor and benefactor, Mr Leslie Fernandes. Father Tom blessed the statue and unveiled the plaque in recognition of the Planting of Trees for the Queen's Jubilee Program.

It was very special to be part of such an impressive ceremony and hear from Linda Klarfeld her inspiration for sculpting
