

DISCERNMENT FOR THE UPCOMING REFERENDUM

Our Catholic tradition is a dynamic truth-seeking tradition. It invites us to use both Faith and Reason to uncover everbetter versions of truth, wrestling with perspectives, ideas and decisions.

The upcoming referendum gives each of us an opportunity to make a decision for Australia. It's easy to be put off by the amount of conflicting 'noise' and simply vote according to gut feel or intuition. But there might be some better ways:-

- 1. Recognise that we are all capable of making good decisions and lousy decisions. In general, good decisions require us to recognise the influence of emotions, our unintentional biases, the impact of time pressure, our assumptions about society, and the expectations of friends, colleagues and family.
- 2.**Identify and consider the key issues.** Give yourself time to sift through the noise, personalities and opinions to identify the 2-3 most significant issues for you.
- 3. Maintain charitable scepticism see the best in the reasoning put forward by opposing arguments. Seek out reliable and, where possible, independent information to fact check opposing claims.
- 4.In addition to hearing the arguments from the politically powerful and wise, seek the views of the quietly-spoken and least powerful. **Listen with courage.**
- 5. Consider how your vote for either yes or no sits with your:
 - Personal values the things that are most important to you in living a meaningful life, lived well;
 - Deepening knowledge of Australian history and hopes for a future Australia;
 - Reading of Listen, Learn, Love the Australian Catholic Bishop's Conference Social Justice Statement 2023-24 (link below) and,
 - Prayerful discernment.

Gospel

A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO MATTHEW 20: 1-16 Why are you jealous because I am generous?

Jesus said to his disciples: 'The kingdom of heaven is like a landowner going out at daybreak to hire workers for his vineyard. He made an agreement with the workers for one denarius a day, and sent them to his vineyard. Going out at about the third hour he saw others standing idle in the market place and said to them, "You go to my vineyard too and I will give you a fair wage." So they went. At about the sixth hour and again at about the ninth hour, he went out and did the same. Then at about the eleventh hour he went out and found more men standing round, and he said to them, "Why have you been standing here idle all day?" "Because no one has hired us" they answered. He said to them, "You go into my vineyard too." In the evening, the owner of the vineyard said to his bailiff, "Call the workers and pay them their wages, starting with the last arrivals and ending with the first." So those who were hired at about the eleventh hour came forward and received one denarius each. When the first came, they expected to get more, but they too received one denarius each. They took it, but grumbled at the landowner. "The men who came last" they said "have done only one hour, and you have treated them the same as us, though we have done a heavy day's work in all the heat." He answered one of them and said, "My friend, I am not being unjust to you; did we not agree on one denarius? Take your earnings and go. I choose to pay the last-comer as much as I pay you. Have I no right to do what I like with my own? Why be envious because I am generous?" Thus the last will be first, and the first, last.'
