Everyday Justice-for people and the planet

Toilet paper is an inescapable purchase. According to some estimates, Australians each consume 88 rolls per year. And there are a lot of choices: two or three-ply, bamboo or paper, recycled or not, made in Australia or elsewhere, wrapped in plastic or paper...?


Parishioners Marie and Barbara have been buying their loo paper from Who Gives a Crap since 2020. They like the convenience of it being delivered for free, no plastic packaging, 100% recycled tissue, and 50% of all profits being donated to improve global sanitation.

"I've got to buy loo paper, and I might as well contribute to improving lives and the planet when doing so... and, yes, home delivery of either 24 or 48 rolls means I don't run out," says Marie.

Globally safe sanitation has improved from 32% to 57% of the population since 2000. That's good progress, but 1.5 billion people lack even 'basic' sanitation. In Sub-Saharan Africa progress has been almost negligible, with more than 50% of the population in some countries currently lacking any form of toilet facilities (source: UN Water).

Barbara says, "I'm not endorsing one brand – there are plenty of choices. Make your own choice according to what is important to you. Reading the label and doing a bit of basic internet research is simple enough. A few minutes of time can help change the world."
